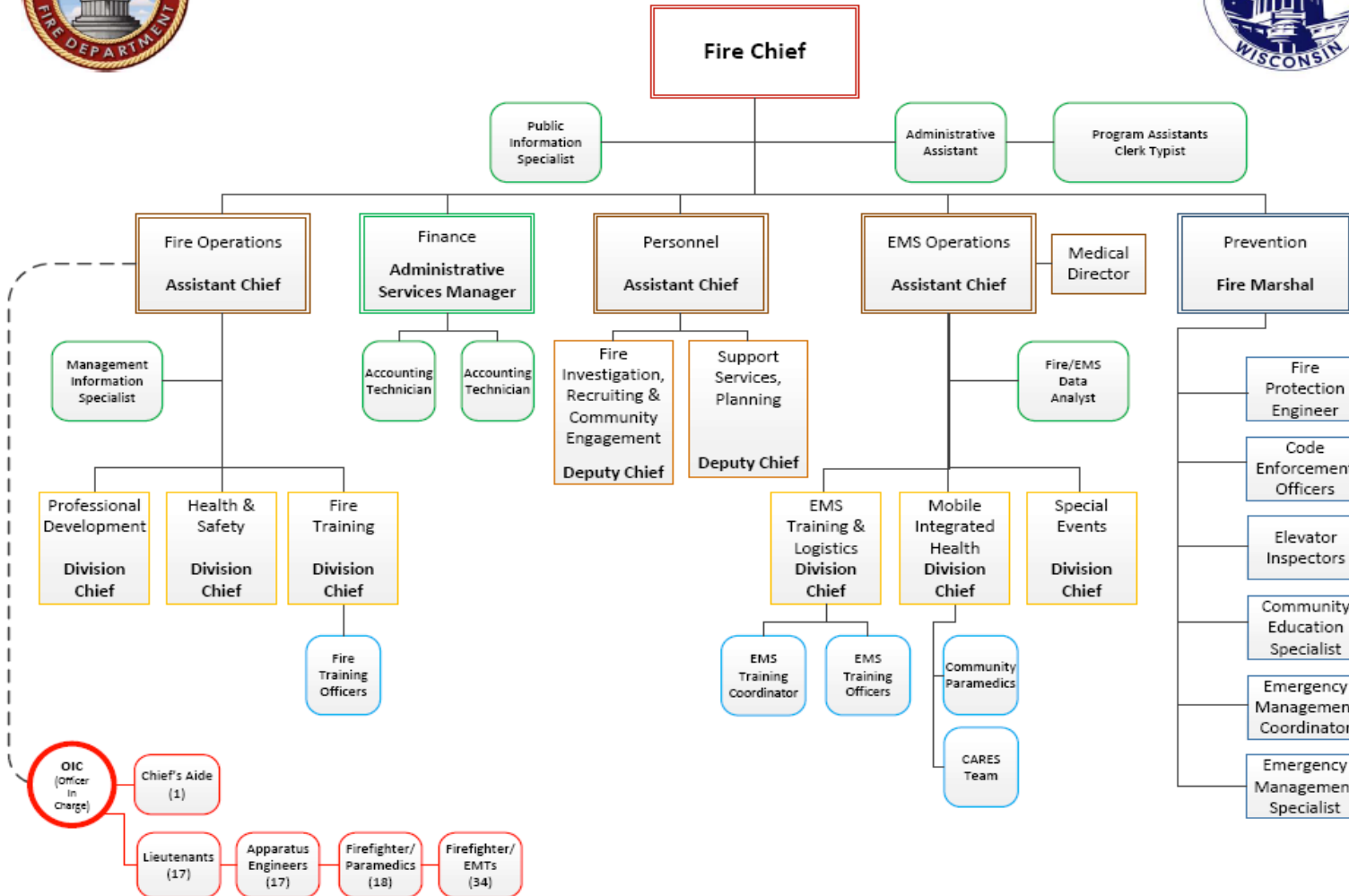

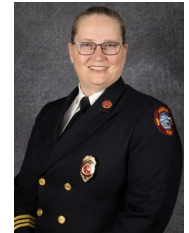

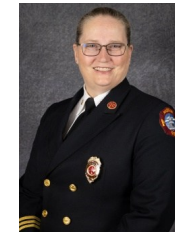

Emergency Medical

- Approximately 77% of the MFD's emergency calls are medical in nature. All MFD firefighters are trained and licensed Wisconsin Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) – Basics. Some of the many skills that EMTs can perform include initial life-saving interventions such as CPR, defibrillation, bleeding management, airway management, overdose care, and the treatment of allergic reactions.

Emergency Medical (continued)

- In addition, there are nine Advanced Life Support ambulances across the city staffed by two paramedics each. All paramedics are certified firefighters and also rotate onto engines and ladders. Our medics are trained to provide many of the immediate life-saving medications and procedures performed in an emergency room. Among others, specialties include cardiac care and airway management.

Fire Protection

- Engine and Ladder companies serve from fourteen fire stations across the city of Madison. Each company consists of one lieutenant (company officer), one apparatus engineer (driver), and two firefighter/EMTs.
- Life safety (search and rescue) is each company's top priority, followed by incident stabilization, and property conservation.

Fire Prevention

- Our Fire Prevention Officers with support from station personnel inspect all public buildings twice a year to ensure compliance with fire codes and city ordinances.
- FPO conduct late night bar capacity checks and other large gatherings to ensure capacity limits are followed and exits are maintained.

Fire Prevention

- The Fire Prevention Division reviews and approves fire sprinklers, fire alarm, and other fire protection systems verifying the design and installation comply with applicable codes and standards.

Elevator Inspection

- Our Elevator Inspection Unit inspects all conveyances annually to ensure compliance with state and national codes and standards.
- Investigate all accidents where an injury occurs as the result of using a conveyance.

Elevator Inspection

- The Elevator Inspection Unit reviews and approves conveyance systems verifying the design and installation comply with applicable codes and standards.

Community Education

- Our Community Educator delivers fire safety presentations to schools, senior centers, businesses, and other community groups.
- Our Community Educator coordinates MFD attendance at parades, station visits, and other community events.

Community Education

- Our Community Educator organizes Safety Saturday, bringing multiple safety-oriented groups to deliver safety messaging on the Capitol Square.
- The MFD is a proud partner to help promote PulsePoint. This app is designed to alert CPR trained citizens via smart phones to greatly improve the chances of a victim's survival during a sudden cardiac arrest.

Emergency Management

- Emergency Management assesses hazards that have the potential to overwhelm our local resources, develops plans to respond to such incidents, works to mitigate the occurrence and/or impact and assists with the community's ability to recover if impacted by a disaster.

Emergency Management

- Runs an Emergency Operations Center that supports an emergency response by obtaining resources, implementing plans, coordinating between jurisdictions, agencies, and non-government organizations for an effective response and speedy recovery.

Community Paramedics

- Aspires to support, educate, and empower at-risk individuals to improve their overall health.
- Community Paramedics pay home visits and connect patients with resources to help them take charge of their own healthcare.

Community Alternative Response

- Community Alternative Response Emergency Services (CARES) is designed to serve as an additional resource for behavioral health emergencies.
- A CARES team is comprised of one MFD community paramedic and one Journey Mental Health Center crisis worker. The teams also focus on building relationships throughout the community to ensure that patients have been connected with the appropriate services.

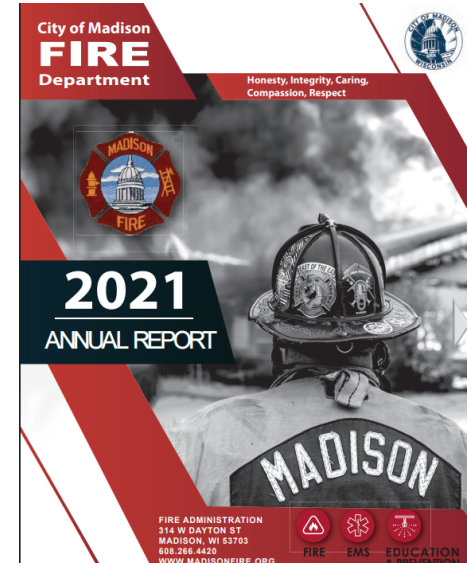
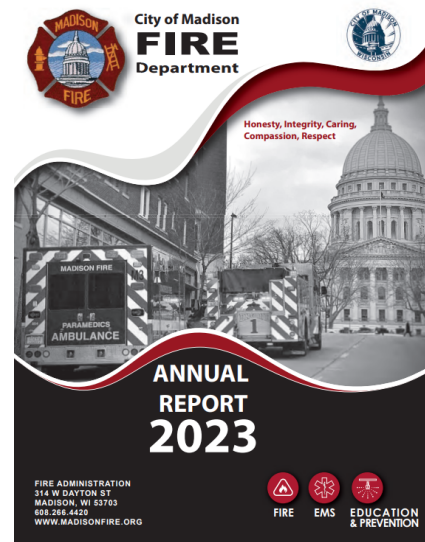
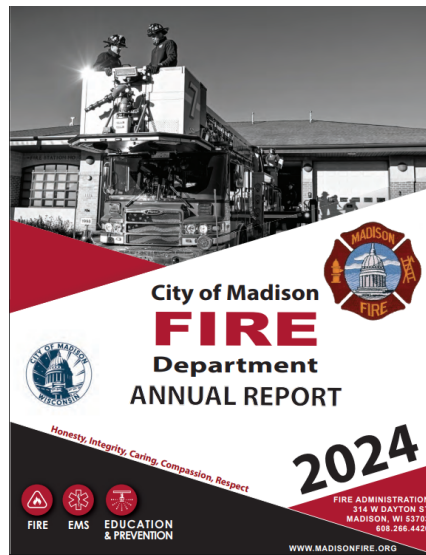
